Building Trust in Schools

Building trust is a key pillar of culture in New Tech schools. Research by Bryk and Schneider at the University of Chicago demonstrates that relational trust among the adults in schools is the key variable in whether schools succeed in adopting new programs and improving student achievement. Drawing from Leading Together, a program of the Center for Courage & Renewal (couragerenewal.org/leadingtogether), participants will experience reflective practices and protocols that help build a trustworthy school culture and develop leadership capacity in the adult community in schools. Participants will receive a packet of protocols and exercises to bring back, and there will be time for planning how this might be integrated into your work with the adult community in your school.

This session will involve a 1 hour post-Summit reflection webinar opportunity on December 5th.
