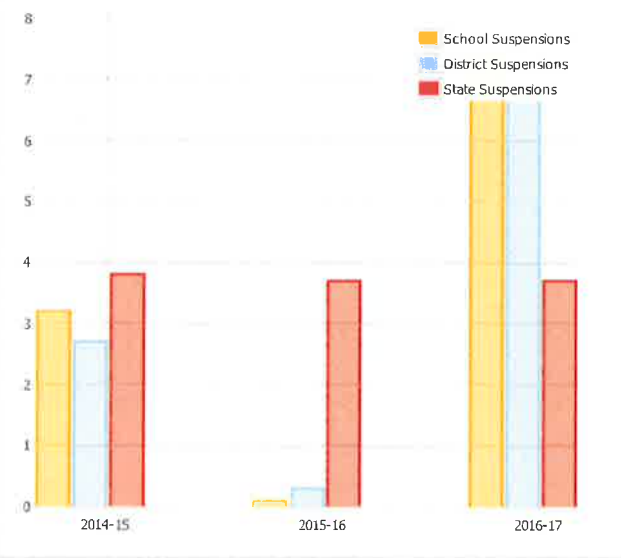

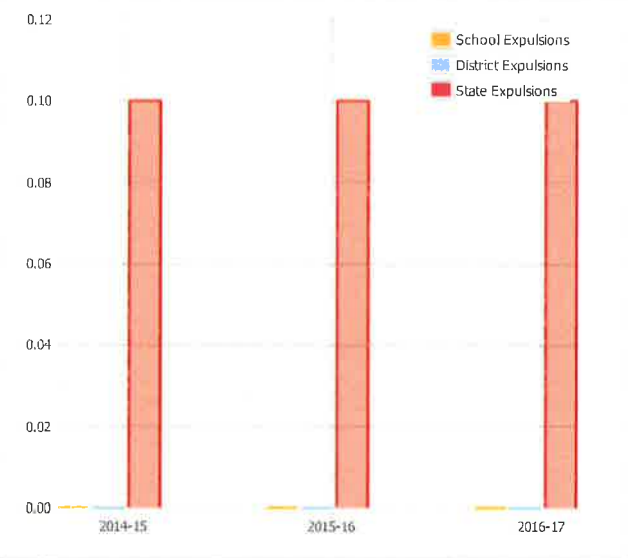

School Safety Plan (School Year 2017-18)

Arena Elementary is committed to the safety and security of each student. The safety plan was reviewed, updated and discussed with staff and site council. To maintain conditions that contribute to the best possible learning environment, the school safety plan includes the following elements:

Data Analysis: The California Healthy Kids Survey, specifically the "School Connectedness" data is a primary focus for consideration. School Climate, LCAP Updates from the Strategic Plan, attendance and discipline data are also reviewed to determine goals.

Ensuring A Safe And Orderly Environment - Component I: Provide anti-bullying/team building campaigns and increase student pride and spirit. Recognize positive student behavior with Pirate Bucks incentive program and "Fun Fridays". Implement a Student Council and begin inter mural academic and continue athletic activities. Support students to be respectful and responsible within classrooms, on campus and at extracurricular activities through implementing and monitoring a consistent unified school wide behavior plan. Educate parents regarding the tools to support students to be successful and share strategies for positive behavior.

Ensuring A Safe And Orderly Environment - Component II: Monthly facility inspections will determine necessary improvements. Communicate and practice emergency drill procedures with staff and students and complete monthly safety drills. A schedule of Earthquake and Fire drills is included in the plan. Staff will provide current contact information for immediate communication in an emergency. Parents are notified through "One Call Now " of school closures and other important information.

An Emergency Operations Plan, The School Accountability Report Card, a campus map and the District Wellness Plan are included in the Safety Plan. All Staff are required to complete a Child Abuse Reporting training each school year. Board policies are updated and available upon request at the school site and district office. 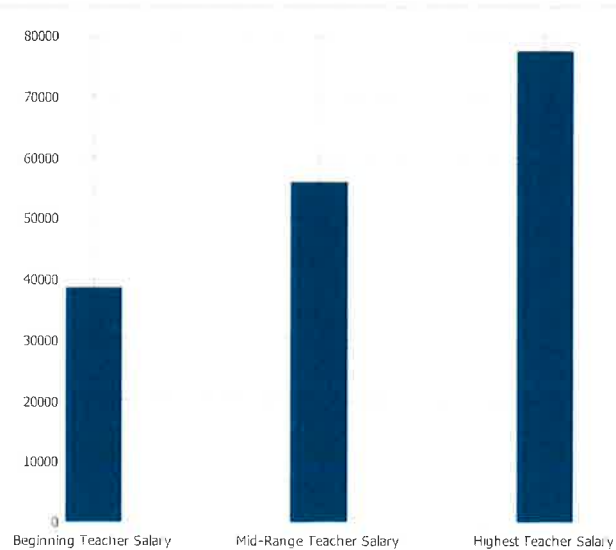

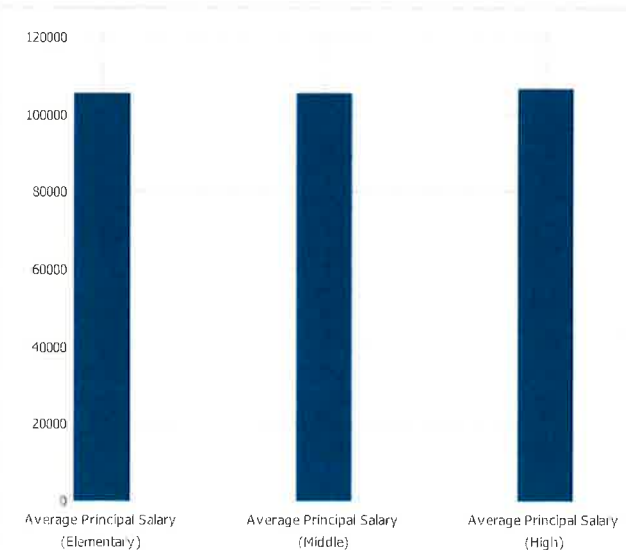

Professional Development

Our 2017-18 Master schedule includes four professional development days. Arena Elementary School teachers have three staff development days before the start of school in the Fall plus an additional day in November. This enables the staff to be well prepared for the students when they return.

Every Wednesday we have early release days that allow us to explore educational opportunities and discuss and reflect on teaching practices and objectives. Our teachers share methodology and often collaborate on projects.
