Arena Families,

It finally feels like we are up and running smoothly after days and days of bad weather in January. The daffodils are starting to bloom and once again, Arena Elementary is the place to be. Middle School basketball teams have been practicing and playing hard. Ramona Mariscal rehearses with her Folkloric Dancers a couple times a week after school, the After School Program has exciting activities like Homework Help, Art, Minecraft, choir, and sports opportunities. We also have a new cheerleading squad coached by Micheline Kirby, Allision Barnes and Leah Kirby.

In regards to academics, grades 3-8 just finished up with taking their Winter MAP Assessments in Reading, Language conventions, Math, (and in grades 5-8) Science. Children learn better—and faster—when teachers have a clear picture of what students know and how they are growing academically. That's why we give these assessments. MAP Assessments are a computer adaptive test which measures what students know. Most importantly, it allows teachers to track growth over time. With progress monitoring, teachers have the ability to create learning opportunities and to provide intervention support for struggling students. It is our goal to help every child learn and grow into a confident, productive human.

Families of 3rd - 8th grade students, please be on the lookout for the MAP Student Report in the mail. It will be sent out by next week. This document will provide information on how your child is performing in the core academic areas. Also included, you will find a MAP Goal Score Chart. There you can locate your child's score and it will identify at what grade level they are performing at. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me or come into the office and I will be happy to assist you.

Ready for Seventh Grade in 2023-2024?

For entry to 7th grade next school year 2023-2024, the following vaccines are required.

- 1 dose of whooping cough booster Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis)
- 2 doses of MMR (Measles, Mumps, and Rubella)
- 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox) for all children entering the 7th grade who have not already received it.

California law requires all students to be fully immunized before they start school.

Please contact your child's health care provider to talk about which vaccines your child may need and schedule an appointment to receive these vaccines.

Please remember to **ask your health care provider for a copy of your child's immunization (shot) record.** The school office requires a recent immunization record to update your child school health record.

Arena Science & Engineering Fair March 3rd

Our local science and engineering fair will be held on Friday, March 3rd, 2023 in the Multi-Purpose Room at Arena Elementary School.

For grades 3rd-8th, The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in each category and section of our local science fair will also be eligible to display their projects and compete for ribbons/medals at the Mendocino County Science Fair, which will be held on March 18th, 2023.

If your child is in middle school, they are required to complete either a STEM project OR a research paper. If your child decides to do a project, I urge you to support and encourage this endeavor. It is acceptable for you to assist your child with his or her project, but keep in mind that it must be primarily his or her own work. Judges will be looking at the amount of student involvement and effort in a project. A science journal should accompany each project.

Researching and displaying a science fair project gives students the opportunity to engage in scientific inquiry, maintain accurate records, and apply the skills and processes of a scientist. We also hope that it will stimulate an interest in science and encourage students to apply creative and critical thought to the solution of science problems. Additionally, we believe it is important to give public recognition to talented students for the work they have done.
