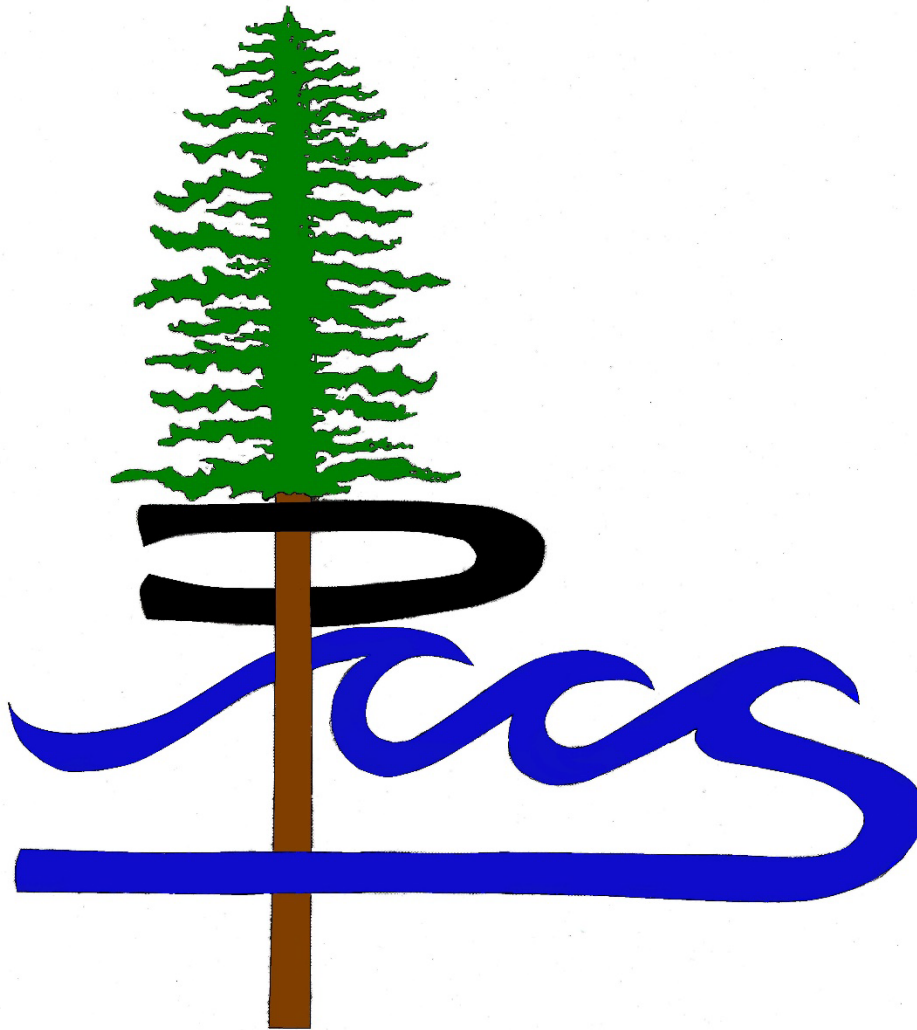

INJURY AND ILLNESS PREVENTION PLAN

The Pacific School strives to meet the objectives set forth in its Safety Program which is part of the school's Safety Program and Disaster Preparedness Plan.

Safety Program & Disaster Preparedness Plan. Part One: Safety Program Objective

The objective of the safety program is to prevent accidents that might result in injury or harm to students, teachers, other school personnel, or visitors, damage to facilities and equipment, or interruption of the educational processes. This objective will be accomplished by providing the following:

- A. Safe and healthful working conditions for all employees and students.*
- B. A school environment conducive to good physical and mental health.*
- C. An environment fostering safe and healthful attitudes, procedures, and practices on the part of all employees and students.*
- D. A security system for buildings and grounds to protect people and property.*

The school's Health and Safety Policy is also a part of the Employee Handbook (the relevant section is highlighted below).

D. HEALTH, SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICIES

PCCS is committed to providing and maintaining a healthy and safe work environment for all employees. Accordingly, PCCS has instituted an Injury and Illness Prevention Program designed to protect the health and safety of all personnel. Every employee will receive a copy of the Injury and Illness Prevention Program, which is kept by the F & HR Manager and is available for your review.

You are required to know and comply with PCCS's general safety rules and to follow safe and healthy work practices at all times. You are required to immediately report to your supervisor any potential health or safety hazards and all injuries or accidents.

In compliance with Proposition 65, PCCS will inform all employees of any known exposure to a chemical known to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity.

BLOOD BORNE PATHOGEN TRAINING

The Pacific School provides Blood Borne Pathogen training at the beginning of each school year, and as new employees are hired. All employees completed the Blood Borne Pathogen training through CharterSafe in September 2022.

HAZARD COMMUNICATION PROGRAM

The Pacific Community Charter School’s Hazard Communication Program is an integral part of the school’s Disaster Preparedness/Emergency Operations Plan. Each potential disaster’s communication procedures follow National Incident Management System (NIMS) and State Emergency Management System (SEMS) protocols. Staff assignments for emergency protocols and roles for the 2022.23 School Year were reviewed with all staff and roles were assigned during a K-12 all staff meeting. A roster of staff assignments is included below.

EMERGENCY PLAN

The Pacific School’s Safety Program and Disaster Preparedness Plan was initially developed in cooperation with the Point Arena Schools District Safety Committee and is reviewed internally on an annual basis. Historically, the Pacific School’s Emergency Plan has been significantly the same as the District Plan, although that may have changed with current updates to the District Plan.

Typically, as part of this plan the Pacific School holds monthly fire drills and at least one “Drop, Cover and Hold On” drill per school semester. Additionally, Pacific School students and staff participate in the statewide earthquake scenario/drill in October. The High School site aligns drills with the Point Arena High School drill schedule.
