

## Arts, Music, & Instructional Materials Block Grant Plan

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[AB 185](#) revised the Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials Discretionary Block Grant. This grant allocates \$3,560,885,000 to LEAs for five purposes enumerated in Section 134(a) of Chapter 52 of the Statutes of 2022), which may be briefly summarized as:

- (1) Obtaining standards-aligned professional development and instructional materials for specified subject areas
- (2) Obtaining professional development and instructional materials for improving school climate
- (3) Developing diverse, culturally relevant and multilingual school library book collections
- (4) Operational costs, including retirement and health care cost increases
- (5) COVID-19-related costs necessary to keep pupils and staff safe and schools open for in-person instruction.

These funds are available for encumbrance through the 2025–26 fiscal year. Section 134(c) provides that LEAs “are encouraged, but not required” to “proportionally use” their allocation for the five purposes enumerated in Section 134(a)(1)–(5).

<p><b>Diverse, Culturally Relevant, and Multilingual Libraries</b> Section 134(a)(3) allows for developing diverse book collections and obtaining culturally relevant texts, in both English and pupils' home languages, to support pupils' independent reading. (Appendix B)</p>	<p>For developing and maintaining relevant texts and book collections in both English and Spanish.</p>	<p>\$20,000 over four years</p>
<p><b>Operational Costs</b> Section 134(a)(4) of AB 181 authorizes spending of these grant funds for "operational costs, including but not limited, to retirement and health care cost increases."</p>	<p>For continual support of the band program by allocating funds to a portion of the Band Teacher's salary and benefits.</p>	<p>\$40,000 over four years.</p>
<p><b>Costs Related to COVID-19</b> Section 134(a)(5) authorizes these grant funds to: "As related to the COVID-19 pandemic, acquire personal protective equipment, masks, cleaning supplies, COVID-19 tests, ventilation upgrades, and other similar expenditures, if they are necessary to keep pupils and staff safe from COVID-19 and schools open for in-person instruction."</p>	<p>For miscellaneous pandemic related supplies (ie. PPE, cleaning products, etc.) to offset the impact on the undistributed operational budget.</p>	<p>\$2,115 over four years</p>

**Appendix A: Ten specified subject areas:** Standards–aligned (if applicable): Visual and performing arts, World languages, Mathematics, Science (including environmental literacy), English Language Arts (including early literacy), Ethnic Studies, Financial literacy, Media literacy, Computer Science, History Social Science

**Appendix B:** It is the Legislature’s intent “that these book collections and culturally relevant texts be used to provide support for pupils through the establishment of site-based school and classroom libraries that are culturally relevant to pupils’ home and community experiences and be available in English, pupils’ home language, or a combination of more than one language.”
