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Arena Union Elementary School District (AUESD) agrees to enter into this Subcontracting Agreement with the Mendocino County Office of Education for participation in the Mendocino County State Preschool Consortium.

The purpose of this agreement is to outline the roles of <u>AUESD</u> and the Mendocino County Office of Education (MCOE). The services to be rendered and the terms and conditions of the Subcontracting Agreement are as follows:

The Mendocino County Office of Education shall:

- Provide a CSPP Program Lead, program secretarial support, and a data technician
- Serve as Coordinator for Consortium districts
- Act as Lead Educational Agency (LEA), draft and submit mandated state reports
- Act as Community Care Licensing (CCL) Liaison and complete CCL applications, write and/or approve reports, as appropriate
- Provide training, support, and technical assistance
- Plan, coordinate, and conduct in-service activities for administrators, Site Supervisors and Lead Teachers
- Provide information on relevant professional development opportunities for all CSPP staff
- Provide guidance for continuous program improvement to ensure objectives are met
- Participate on interview committees for Site Supervisor and Lead Teacher positions
- Provide input on Site Supervisor and Lead Teacher evaluations
- Provide joint fiscal monitoring
- Charge no more than 3% indirect costs to the State Preschool contract
- Maintain equipment inventory lists on all purchases made with allocation dollars that are over \$500 per item OR that are designated equipment with a life beyond one year (see Attachment B); these items belong to the State Preschool Consortium, as per California State Preschool Program contract regulations
- Provide funds for the operations of the program as follows: AUESD will be reimbursed at the rate of \$33.19 per child, per days of certified enrollment up to full entitlement, not to exceed actual expenditures, subject to the final 2024/25 CSPP contract allocation. In addition, a payment of \$141 per child enrolled, per month will be paid on a quarterly basis.
- Provide technical assistance on participation in Quality Counts Mendocino, to district preschool staff and administrators.
- Complete all enrollments for state preschool students and provide all required data reporting to state agencies.

The Subcontractor (AUESD) shall:

- Operate the California State Preschool Program according to California Department of Education, Early Education Division (CDE/EED) guidelines for a minimum of 5 days per week, 175 days per school year, 3 hours per day
- Provide and maintain the preschool facility and make any required repairs
- Coordinate and provide support services/categorical services for students as needed (i.e.: food services, special education services, secretarial support, nursing services)
- Comply with CDE/EED 24/25 Contract Terms and Conditions as found at https://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/cd/ctc2024.asp
- Meet California Code of Regulations, Title 22 Division 12, Chapter 1 health and safety standards as found at Child Care Regulations cdss.ca.gov
- Provide staffing for sites per CDE/EED requirements Attachment A
- Provide staff supervision at sites, who will communicate with the MCOE CSPP Lead regarding any accolades or concerns with Site Supervisor or Lead Teacher personnel
- Require Site Supervisors and Lead Teachers to attend scheduled monthly meetings which will include professional development activities and updates to regulations
- Provide paid time for Preschool staff to participate in Quality Counts Mendocino or Embedded Instruction continuous improvement grant programs. The subcontractor agrees to provide 15 supplemental hours per staff member participating in Quality Counts Mendocino, if additional hours are required to complete the Quality Improvement goals set by their QCC coach and staff.
- Include the CSPP Lead in interviews and/or decisions for Site Supervisor and Lead Teacher positions, including hiring and employment separation
- Accept input from the CSPP Lead regarding evaluation and review of staff performance into district personnel files or for disciplinary measures
- Perform an annual performance evaluation on Site Supervisor and Teacher positions with input from MCOE CSPP Lead
- Comply with CDE Desired Results Program requirements: www.desiredresults.us
- Draft and submit mandated reports to MCOE by due dates
- Comply with fiscal monitoring guidelines for CSPP as outlined by CDE
- Provide joint fiscal accountability
- Charge no more than 5% indirect costs to the California State Preschool Program contract
- Submit a detailed, cost allocation 2024-25 budget to the MCOE CSPP Lead or MCOE Business Manager upon request

Further, the Subcontractor (AUESD) understands:

- The time for subcontractor performance shall not begin prior to, nor shall the time extend beyond, the time period of the contract between the contractor and the state.
- The subcontractor, and the agents and employees of the subcontractor, in the performance of the subcontract, are acting in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees or agents of the State of California.

- Any modifications of the subcontract shall be in writing, and for subcontracts in excess
 of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), prior written CDE approval is required unless the
 subcontract is otherwise exempt from prior CDE approval.
- The subcontract is the complete and exclusive statement of the mutual understanding
 of the parties and that the subcontract supersedes and cancels all previous written and
 oral agreements and communications relating to the subject matter of the subcontract.
- MCOE reserves the right to terminate a subcontract if Title 5 and/or Title 22
 requirements outlined under the subcontractor duties are not met. If a contract is
 terminated MCOE shall contact the CDE/Early Education Division (EED) of its intent to
 terminate the contract at least 90 calendar days prior to the date the contractor intends
 to terminate the contract.
- In the case of a breach of contract, for subcontracts in excess of ten thousand dollars, MCOE will work with the subcontractor on an action plan with specific timelines to come into compliance with the subcontract, giving a maximum of 45 days to rectify the deficiency. If action steps are not taken by the subcontractor according to the timelines agreed upon, the contract will be terminated.
- If MCOE notifies CDE/EED of a termination of a contract, within 15 days MCOE will
 provide CDE/EED with the following information: current inventory of all equipment
 purchased with CSPP dollars and the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all
 families served by the contract and all staff members funded by the contract. CDE/EED
 will then transfer the program to another agency as soon as practicable. Further the
 contractor and subcontractor are obligated to work cooperatively with the EED for the
 transition of families.
- The State of California retains title to any equipment or supplies purchased with state funds and the equipment shall be returned to the contractor upon termination of the subcontract. The subcontract shall also specify that the subcontractor shall obtain prior written approval from the contractor and the CDE for any unit of equipment that costs in excess of five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
- The subcontractor shall be reimbursed for travel and per diem expenses only at rates that do not exceed the rates paid to the CDE's non-represented employees computed in accordance with California Department of Human Resources regulations, CCR, Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 3, Subchapter 1.
- The subcontractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State of California, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and losses occurring or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, laborers and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work, services, materials or supplies in connection with the performance of the subcontract, and from any and all claims and losses occurring or resulting to any person, firm or corporation that may be injured or damaged by the subcontractor in the performance of the subcontract.
- The subcontractor shall maintain records for program review, evaluation, audit and/or other purposes and make the records available to agents of the state for a period of five (5) years.
- The provisions of the "Nondiscrimination Clause" included in the prime contract as specified in the 2 CCR 11105.

- The subcontractor is liable for any audit exception caused by, or as a result of, the subcontractor's lack of performance as required by the subcontract.
- The subcontractor, its agents, and employees, in the performance of the subcontract, are acting in an independent capacity and not as agents or employees of the contractor.
- Subcontracts for ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or more cannot become effective and binding on either the prime contractor or the subcontractor until approved in writing by the CDE, and any work performed by the subcontractor prior to the date of such approval shall not be used as a claim against the state.
- Modifications to any contracts for \$10,000 or more shall also not be effective until approved in writing by the CDE and any work in performance of such modification prior to the date of approval of the modification shall not be used as a claim against the state.

Equipment Inventory

Safeguard against loss, damage, and theft; maintain equipment in good condition

- Detailed property records (recommended for all assets)
- Physical inventory every 2 years; reconciled to property records
- CSAM recommends yearly

2 CFR 200.313 & 200.302(b) CT&Cs III.H, CSAM Procedure 770 & 410

Distinguish between Supply & Equipment

- 1. Does the item lose its original shape and appearance with use?
- 2. Is it consumable, with a normal service life of less than on year?
- 3. Is it easily broken, damaged, or lost in normal use?
- 4. Is it usually more feasible to replace it with an entirely new unit than to repair it?

CSAM - Procedure 770

Distinguish between Supply & Equipment

- 5. Is it included into another unit item, rather than being an independent unit?
- 6. Is the cost of tagging and inventory a substantial percentage of the item's cost?
- 7. Is the cost of the item below the LEA's capitalization threshold?

Examples

Items to Inventory

- Appliances dishwasher, refrigerator, deep freezer
- Commercial-Grade Furniture tables, chairs, desk cubbies
- Electronic Devices iPads/tablets, cameras, security system
- General commercial-grade area rugs, air conditioning units
- Office Equipment copy machine, shredders, computers

Not Considered Inventory

- · Bedding cushions, blankets, pillows
- Instructional Materials puzzles, Lego blocks, soft toys, dramatic play props.
- · Supplies pens, pencils, paper, crayons
- Utensils

Attachment A

Staffing Qualifications

Site Supervisor Qualifications

- A permit issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing authorizing supervision of a child care and development program operating in single site. This can be any of the following permits:
 - o Child Development Site Supervisor Permit
 - o Child Development Program Director Permit
 - o Children's Center Supervision Permit

OR

 A current teaching credential issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing authorizing teaching service in elementary school with 12 units of ECD/CD, plus 3 units of Supervised Field Experience in ECE/CD setting

OR

• An Administrative Services Credential authorizing administration or supervision in public schools in California with 12 units of ECD/CD, plus 3 units of Supervised Field Experience in ECE/CD setting

Teacher Qualifications

- A permit issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing authorizing service in the care, development, and instruction of children in a child care and development program. This can be either of the following permits:
 - o Child Development Master Teacher Permit
 - o Child Development Teacher Permit
 - o Child Development Associate Teacher Permit (Note: This permit authorizes the holder to supervise Assistant Permit holders and an aide.)

OR

• A BA or higher (does not have to be in ECE/CD) with 12 units in ECE, plus 3 units of Supervised Field Experience in ECE/CD setting

Staffing Ratios (EC 8288, 5CCR 18290, 18291, and 18292)

The following minimum ratios shall be maintained in all centers:

1:8 adult -child ratio.

1:24 teacher-child ratio.

Compliance with these ratios shall be determined based on actual attendance.
